# The timeline of preparing and applying

- Years 1 and 2: achieve high grades in Psychology courses, get involved in research if possible, figure out your specific interests
- Year 3: be sure to get involved in research and consider an independent project, make connections with faculty, begin looking at schools and contacting potential advisors, apply to MUGSS!
- Fall of year 4: communicate with potential advisors, take the GRE (if not earlier), apply apply!
